As a part of ISR activity and supporting the concept of Swachh Bharat, SBPIM in Association with Rotary Club Shivajinagar organized an awareness session on how to Dispose Sanitary Waste.

Swachh Bharat and Clean India are matters of National Priority for every Indian. Pune and PMC's waste-pickers handle about 40 thousand kilograms of DIRTY DIAPERS and SANITARY PADS everyday, exposing themselves to diseases like Staphylococcus, hepatitis, E- coli, salmonella and typhoid. Sanitary waste is silent and a mounting problem in India. Every day, Swachh workers collect 6.5 lakh kilograms of waste from over five lakh houses of Pune,

which they hand-segregate into dry and wet waste. Out of that, 3 per cent is sanitary waste, meaning they handle nearly 40 thousand kg of dirty diapers and Sanitary pads every day. The Red Dot Campaign was launched by My Rotary Club in association with Swachh (NGO which has waste pickers from all over Pune District), which segregates "Sanitary Napkin Waste" from normal solid waste.

Female staff and students of SBPIM attended the session which was conducted by Mrs. Anjali Gadgil from Rotary club, who spoke about the seriousness of the issue of disposing sanitary waste properly in order to protect the health of the Swachh workers and also help in cleaning the environment clean. Dr. Smita Jog also addressed the health related issues of the female staff and students.
