**Outcomes: -**

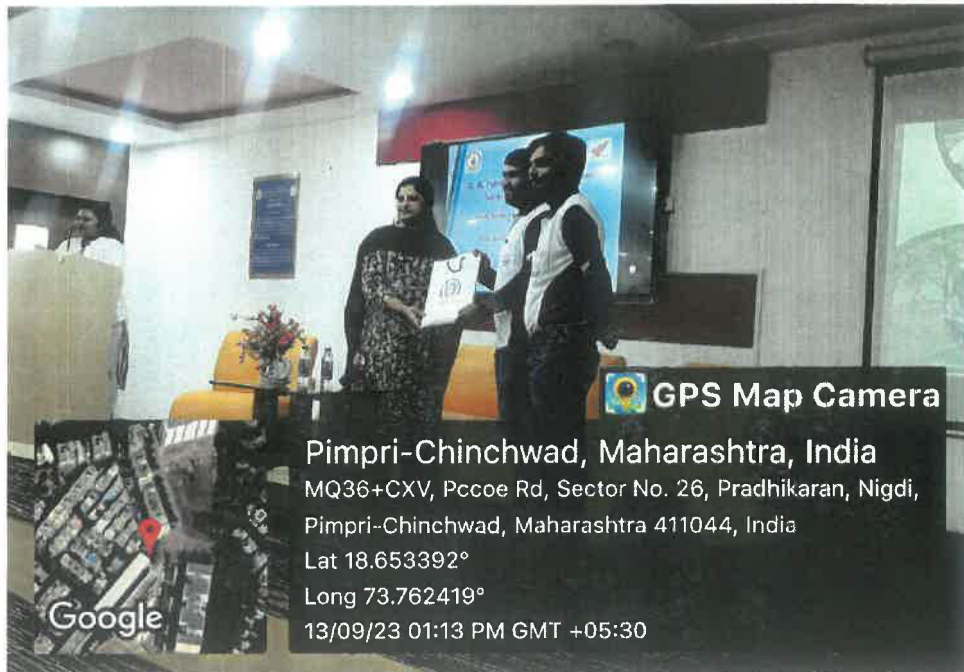
1. Enhanced awareness and knowledge: Student demonstrated a deeper understanding of road safety rules, regulations, and hazards, confirming the success of the educational component.

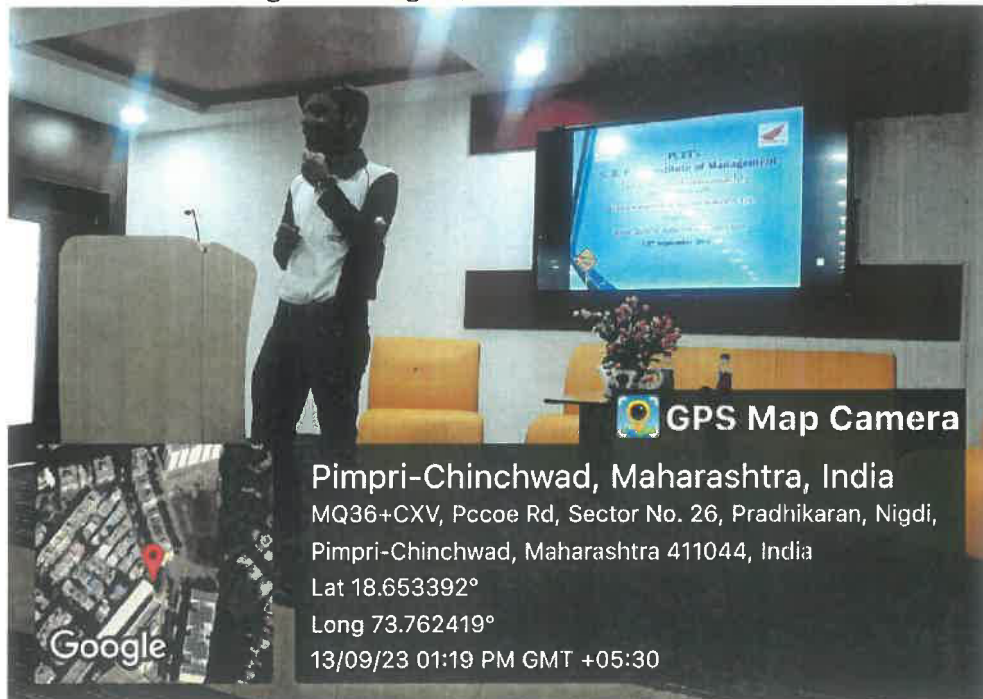

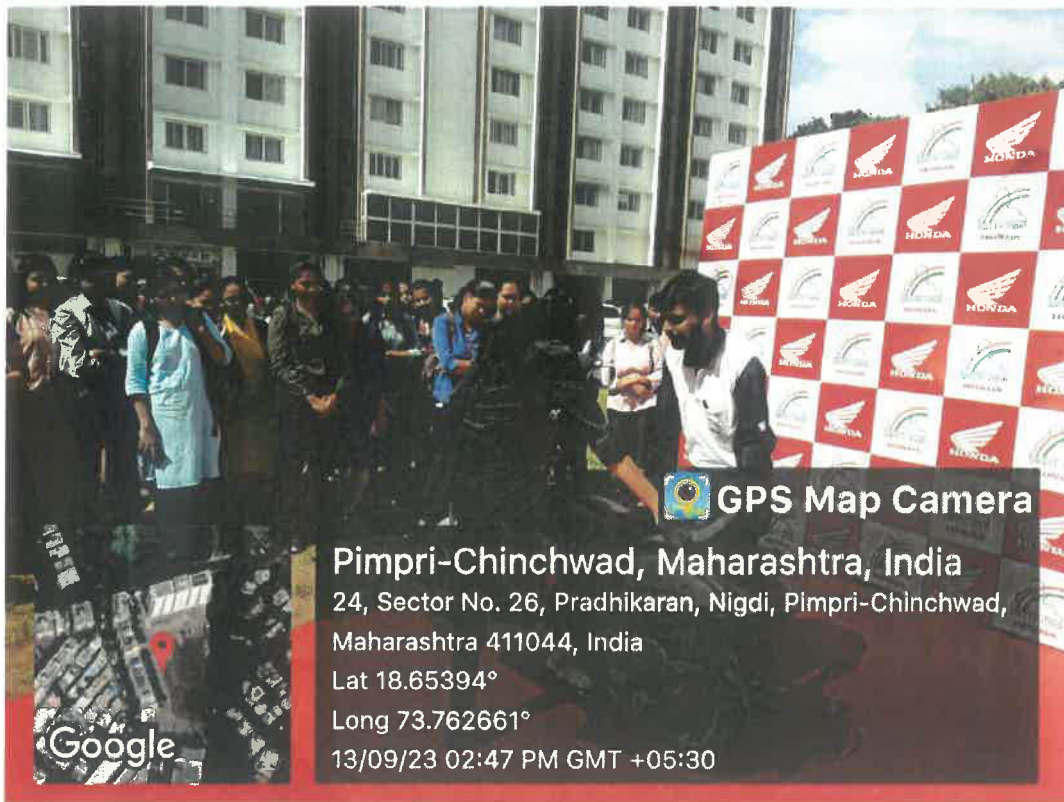



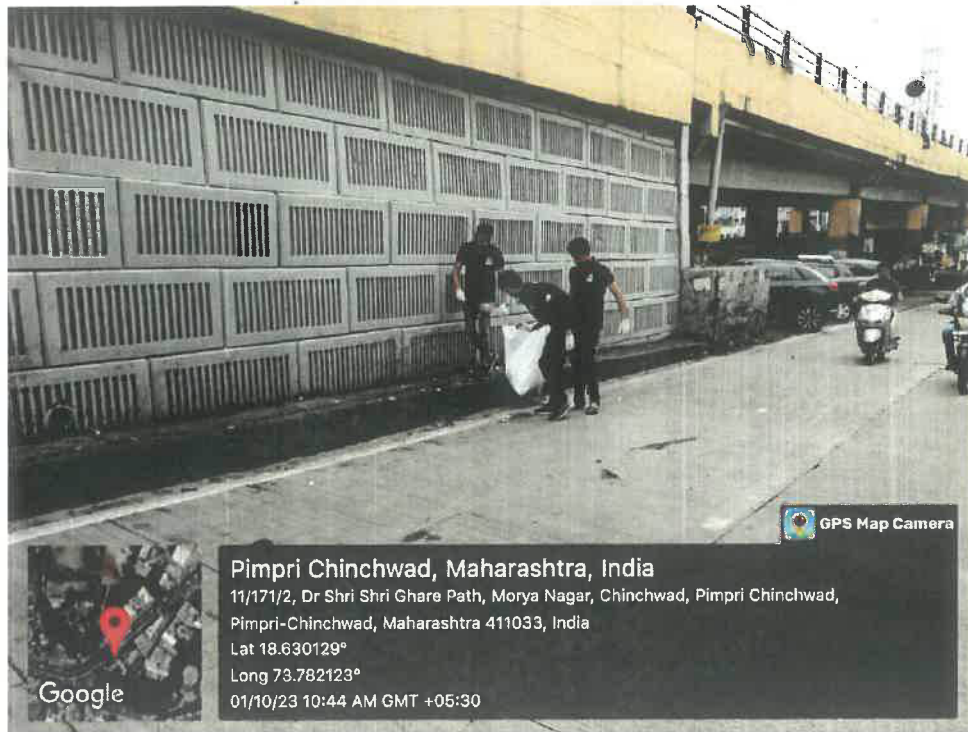

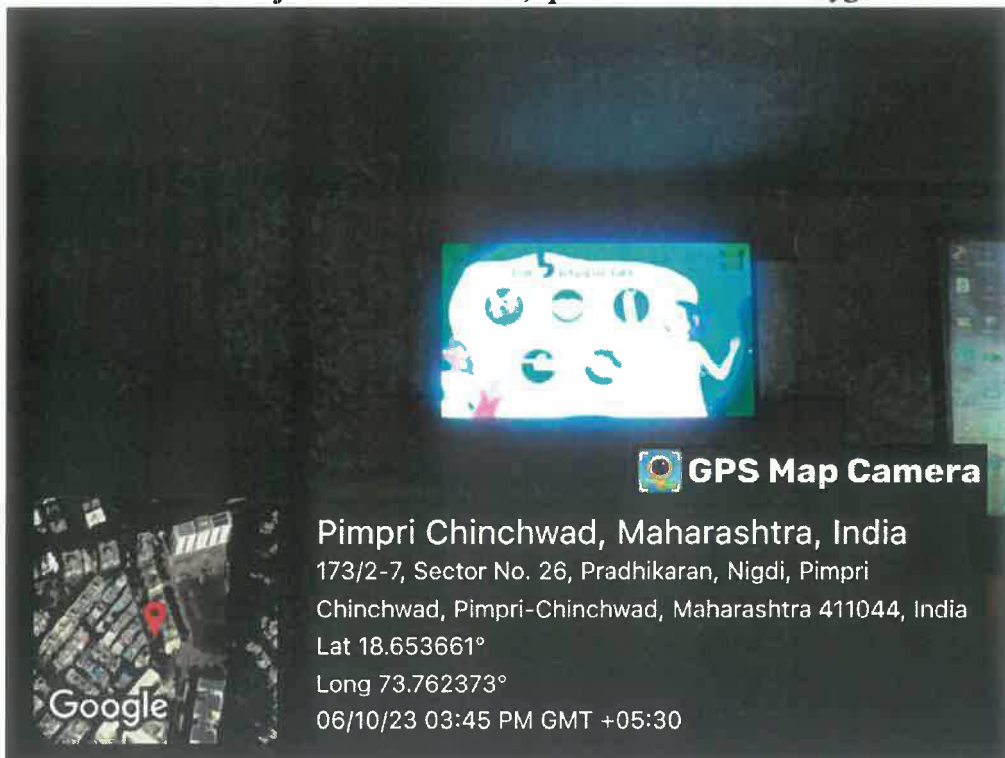

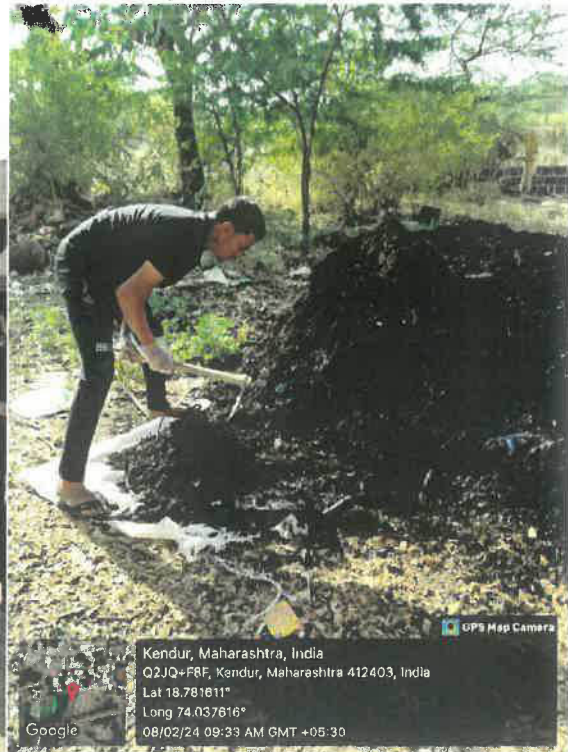

The camp was set up in reading hall of our college with separate areas for registration, medical check-ups, donation, and post-donation refreshment. The process was streamlined as follows:

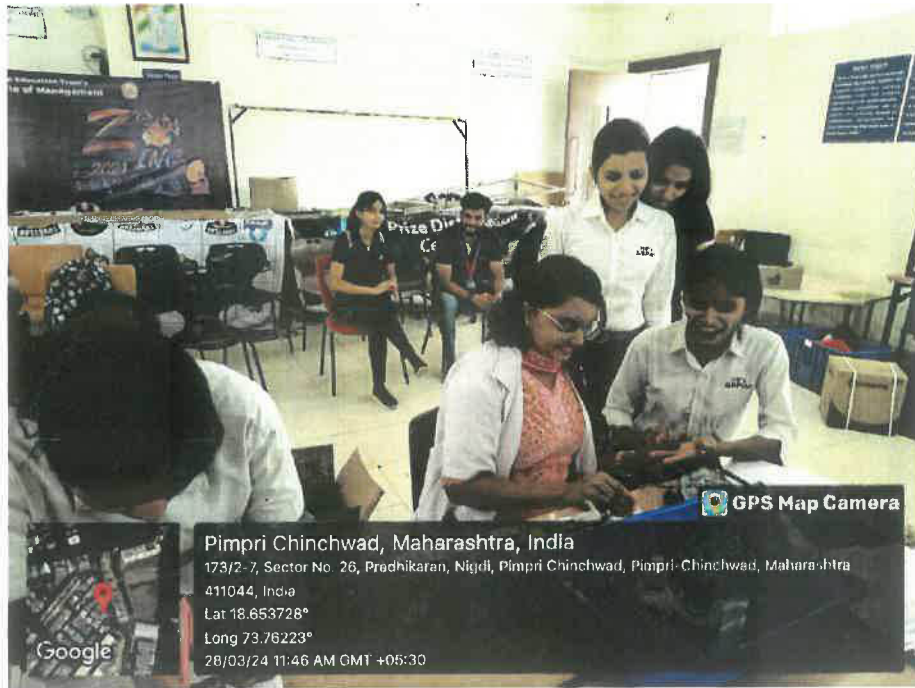
1. **Registration:** Volunteers assisted donors in filling out the necessary forms.

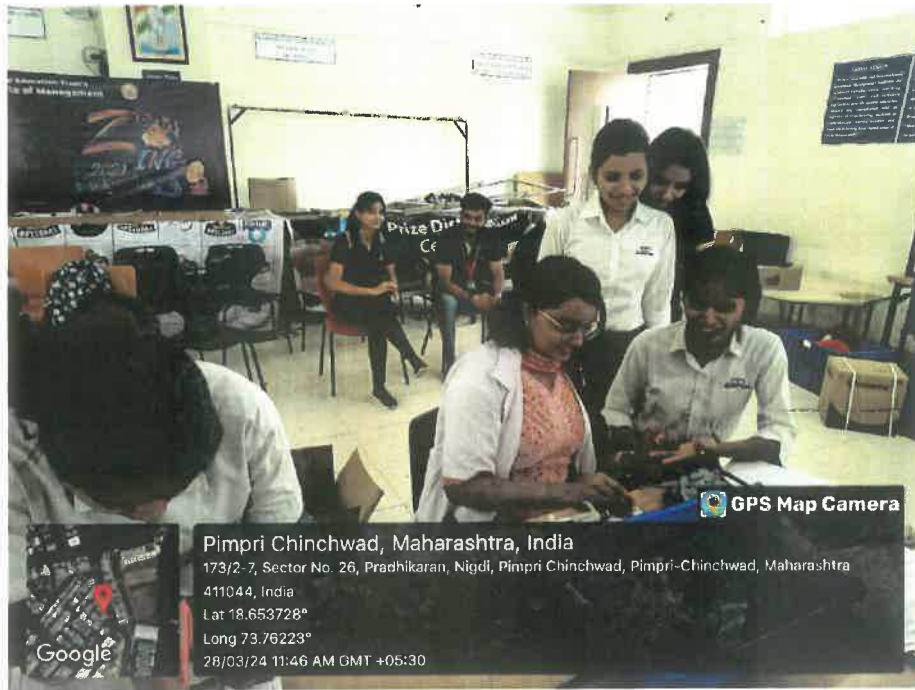
