**Feedback Analysis Report**

- **Teachers Feedback:**

The feedback provided by Teachers suggests that the curriculum introduced has got in depth content to bring out holistic development in the students personality. Few of the teachers however have shown strong concern related to specific courses identified by them. They feel that curriculum is comparatively supplementary to real life situations than earlier. They have also expressed that the curriculum is updated and also includes recent trends up-to a certain level only. Teachers have given the impression that curriculum of course has the ability to instill creativity in students. They believe that the courses in program will successfully inculcate values and professional ethics in students. They are confident that the program curriculum will successfully bridge the gap between theory and practical. They are satisfied with the infrastructural facilities on campus.

- **Parents Feedback:**

From feedback collected from parents, it was found that they were able to see visible changes in their ward's analytical behavior thus leading to improved decision making ability. Parents have agreed that by way of getting better opportunities to showcase their skills, their ward has developed personality traits. They are satisfied with the infrastructure on campus. Parents also voiced that the ward is better prepared to face difficult situations and has become more employable.

- **Alumni Feedback:**

The Alumni feedback suggests the curriculum has helped to develop managerial skills and team work. They have expressed that the curriculum moderately developed analytical and decision making skills. They have shown concern about


the ability to contribute to organizational goals as the curriculum inculcated leadership skills to some extent only. The Alumni suggested in having more interaction with the industry and were happy with the infrastructural facilities provided by the institute.

- **Employers Feedback:**

The employers were less apprehensive about the students being able to bridge the gap between theory and practical application after pursuing the programme. They agreed that course added to their team working abilities and the programme curriculum covers the industry required skills only to a certain extent and more emphasis should be put on value added certification courses as well. They suggested the curriculum should concentrate more on enhancing the student's skill sets required in the corporate world. They would definitely love to recruit more students from our college in the near future.
